### WANTED

Items for the Magazine. All things considered.

Parish Council Meeting held via ZOOM on 4<sup>th</sup> May. Those attending Vice Chairman Tim Close, Cllr Glyn Evans, Cllr Paula Tuck, Cllr Louise Smith apologies were received from Chairman Terry Pinner Cllr Sally Smith, Cllr Ben Parkin, Cllr Shaun Burton and one member of the public who raised the issue of the management of roadside verges in the Parish in line with the CCC approved policy. Ref: [www.onthevergecambridge.org.uk](http://www.onthevergecambridge.org.uk) Further guidance can be found on the Plant Life charity website <https://plantlife.love-wildlife.org.uk> the resident also raised a concern that a mature tree was to be cut down to allow the expansion of the Lt Stukeley Village Hall.

The position of a replacement clerk to the SPC was formally approved and accepted.

Following government guidelines and until further notice remote meetings will be discontinued as of 6<sup>th</sup> May 2021, meetings beyond that date will be held in person, keeping within government guidelines as to social distancing.

Planning application [21/00764/REM](#)

Submission of Reserved Matters approval for the erection of 261 dwellings including appearance, layout, landscaping, associated highways, and ancillary works. Parcel 7 Senliz Road Alconbury Weald.

Planning adviser to the SPC advised that this is a well-presented plan for 261 homes on parcel 7 presented by Carla Homes, and is part of the original phase 1 plan. Cllr GE asked for clarity on the size of the development at present and the progress of the agreed Southern access. This is at present in the hands of CCC Highways, waiting a decision and approval of the junction with the A141.

He also updated SPC on The Stukeleys Pocket Park Project the redeveloping of Great Stukeley Playing Field into Recreation / Pocket park – and reported that the application remains at the pre app phase with Huntingdon District Council.

An application has been made to CCC by contractors Breheny for road closures with a proposed date of 28<sup>th</sup> June 2021 in regard to infrastructure works to be carried out to install road humps on Ermine Street. The council formally thanked Councillor Burton for his persistence and diligence in pursuing all parties involved in this project.

A proposal was made to pursue the purchase of solar powered speed signs on Ermine St. at the approaches to both villages.

Correspondence was received from a Great Stukeley resident regarding the ongoing housing development on Alconbury Weald and resulting increase in traffic numbers and what is a likely date for commencement of the proposed Southern access route. Clerk to respond when the Parish Council have been fully updated by the planning adviser.

The Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council will be on 24<sup>th</sup> May 2021. APM starting at 6.45-7.15 and the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council from 7,15 onwards. Venue TBC. The public and press will be asked to join remotely.

# MAKING THE STUKELEYS MORE NATURE-FRIENDLY: A CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS

This magnificent tree is a mature Norway Maple tree. It stands at the back of the Little Stukeley Village Hall and is probably more than 50 years old.



Despite its name, this handsome tree species has been around in Britain since the 17<sup>th</sup> Century. So, frankly, I was shocked to find that our Parish Council has been destroying such mature trees around the village hall area. Last year, an even taller Birch tree was cut down for no apparent reason. Now, this Norway Maple is slated for destruction to extend the bar area in the hall. The Parish Council have put in the planning application, and despite my best efforts, the tree's fate appears to be sealed.

This depressing fact has motivated me to reach out to members in our village community who also care about trees and nature in general. Over the past year, many of us have found solace and pleasure in the natural environment in and around The Stukeleys.

Alongside the news about Covid-19, reports have also illustrated the sad state of wildlife in the UK and further afield: the United Nations revealed that around one million animal and plant species are threatened with extinction. The World Wildlife Fund reported that the planet's wildlife populations have plummeted by 68% since 1970.

Sir David Attenborough has added his voice to the concerns about the biodiversity crisis in the BBC programme *Extinction: The Facts*.

Every one of us can do something to help: we can do our bit to restore biodiversity. A good example is the UK's insect population. We have lost 50 per cent of insects in the UK since 1970 due to urbanisation, agriculture and an obsession with outdoor tidiness.

## **Why do insects matter?**

Pollinators – such as butterflies and moths, bees, hoverflies, flies and wasps – are an essential part of our ecosystem. Not only are they an important element in the food chain for birds, bats and other

insect-eaters, they also pollinate the majority of the world's flowering and fruiting plants. Did you know that for a strawberry flower to turn into a strawberry it needs to be visited five times by a bumblebee or 15 times by a honeybee? That's just for one strawberry! It's estimated that one in three mouthfuls of food we eat depends on pollinators. Without bees, hoverflies and other insects visiting flowers there would be no strawberries, apples, carrots, olives, broccoli, avocados, chocolate, grapes, almonds.....

Nesting sites and habitats for pollinators are disappearing dramatically: more than 97 percent of our wildflower meadows have been eradicated since World War II. Insect populations are plummeting due to this loss and fragmentation of habitat, widespread pesticide use, diseases and climate change.

- Half of the UK's 27 bumblebee species are in decline
- Two-thirds of moths are in long-term decline
- 76 percent of butterflies are in decline

Is it any wonder that all the species which depend on insects are faring the same, with declines in hedgehogs, bats and nearly all species of once common farmland birds? Did you know that there are 50 per cent fewer hedgehogs since 2000? – they are now classed as vulnerable to extinction.



### **What is the good news?**

Would you like to see wildflowers grow, flower and set seed - and be visited by pollinators - on the many grassy areas and road verges in and around The Stukeleys?

In fact, Cambridgeshire County Council has recently (March 2021) approved a plan to manage roadside verges for wildflowers and biodiversity. In collaboration with a movement called 'ON THE VERGE' (<https://www.onthevergecambridge.org.uk/>) , I have already requested if The Stukeleys Parish Council would consider changing the management of verges and grassy areas. These areas would provide a brilliant opportunity to allow wildflowers to grow and provide a natural resource for people and pollinators – without the need for a big expenditure. In fact, it would save the council money!

All that is needed is a change to the current frequent mowing schedule: in brief, cut less (only once or twice per year) and change the timing of cutting from spring to late summer or autumn. This can save money: Dorset adopted a new strategy for managing its highway verges in 2014. Since then, the council estimates it has saved £100,000 through, among other things, fewer cuts of road verges. Cutting less and cutting later allows flowers to bloom and set seed and allows pollinators to use them as food and habitat. And it looks great!



### **Nature-friendly Volunteers needed!**

Following the success of 'ON THE VERGE' in Cambridge', volunteers are needed to take action in The Stukeleys and Huntingdon area. This community action group will work with the local Council, schools, businesses and other local groups to identify areas of land suitable for growing nectar rich plants and wildflowers. We seek permission for use, organise the preparation of the land, raise funds to purchase seed and help with the sowing of the sites. We provide an aftercare plan so that the site will continue to regenerate year after year, providing a lasting legacy for our community, especially our kids and grandkids.

Many of us pass these areas every day: if we managed them differently, we wouldn't have to make a special trip to a designated wildlife area to see the beauty of our natural environment. Please add your voice and ask The Stukeleys Parish Council to become more nature friendly. Let's protect our local trees and introduce sympathetic grass mowing regimes -, let's make space for wildflowers and pollinators.

## April Update from The Huntingdon Neighbourhood Team

This month we've seen the reopening of Huntingdon town centre. Lots of work has gone on behind the scenes with partners to ensure everyone is safe as restrictions ease and gyms, shops, hairdressers and pubs with outdoor areas reopen.

Everyone's efforts have allowed us to move on to the next step of the Government's roadmap. However, it still depends on us to keep following current guidance so we can reach the next stage.

We were delighted to receive a visit from Chief Constable Nick Dean last week who recognised the proactive work we've been doing tackling organised crime groups, arresting high risk domestic abuse suspects and other high-risk offenders.



## What's going on

This month we've carried out a number of warrants including in Bradshaw Close and Maule Close in Huntingdon, in Sawtry and most recently in Yaxley resulting in a number of arrests.

We've recovered thousands of pounds worth of drugs including cocaine and cannabis as well as cash, mobile phones and other drug paraphernalia.



The warrants are often as a result of information received by members of the public and we encourage [you to continue reporting suspicious activity around drugs.](#)

By day we've been patrolling the town as part of the re-opening, tackling anti-social behaviour in and around the town, carrying out stop searches and seizing knives. By night we're patrolling the A1123 corridor looking for suspicious vehicles and activity.

# Free Covid Tests



Residents in the Stukeleys and Alconbury Weald are being urged to get twice-weekly rapid Covid tests.

The move is an important step forward to meet the aims of the national roadmap, allowing everyone to move safely out of lockdown.

Twice-weekly rapid testing is a vital tool in identifying cases of Covid-19 that would otherwise be missed. With 1 in 3 people with coronavirus showing no symptoms and potentially spreading it without knowing, rapid testing helps to identify positive cases quickly, preventing the spread of infection.

There are several ways you can access rapid testing. You can take a test at one of the rapid testing sites locally. Your employer may be offering testing in the workplace.

You can also collect tests to complete at home or order tests to be delivered to your home. Secondary school pupils are also being asked to take a twice-weekly test.




