

THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Four Parish Councillors, one County Councillor, one Parish Clerk and three residents attended the Parish Council Meeting held at Little Stukeley Village Hall on the 7th April 2014.

During the Public Participation Session, One resident queried why the Parish Council were paying Anglian Water's charges in respect of the allotments in Great Stukeley. It was explained that these costs were covered by the rents received from allotment holders. A resident expressed that she felt that chickens wandering loose in the highway were not a problem and in fact gave an ambience to the village. It was noted that the issue was also that they wandered into other people's gardens.

County Councillor Peter Ashcroft stated that there will be further consultation on A14, as the road will no longer be tolled and there was a need to redesign part of the road.

The Parish Council were disappointed with CCC Highway's decision not to repair the broken post in Green End. Young Hornbeams on the allotments have now been planted and the pump reinstated and repaired. There is a problem with rabbits getting under the gap under the gate in the Playing Fields, this is to be investigated and rectified. Work on Footpath 13 has now been completed.

The Market Town Transport Strategy (MTTS) is about the future of road and transport around Huntingdon, a new strategy is need for Huntingdon Market Town that looks at the significance of new developments. A Draft MTTS is currently under review.

There were concerns with traffic issues at Green End and the industrial unit at Grange Farm. The Council has written to Huntingdonshire District Council (HDC) on the issue.

There is a need for a central storage unit on the allotments as allotments holders are not permitted to build sheds on their allotments. The original plan for area did contain plans for a central storage unit, therefore three quotations for the work are being obtained for consideration by the Parish Council at a later meeting.

The Parish Council is one of the smallest Parish Councils with the one of the biggest brown site developments (Alconbury Weald) in the country in it's Parish. With the increased workload associated with such a development The Stukeley's Parish Council had to reflect the associated increased costs in an increased precept. As well as other costs, such as village grass cutting and maintenance charges, printing costs for the Parish Magazine, which is highly valued by the all Parishioners of The Stukeleys, have increased substantially over a number of years. Also the Parish Council did not received the Council Tax Support Grant from HDC this year and its income had been reduced when Hinchingsbrooke Park was no long included in The Stukeley's Parish Council Boundary. The Stukeley's level of precept is within mid-range of precepts charged by other Parish Councils and in fact is less than others (Huntingdon, Holywell-cum-Needingworth, Houghton & Wyton, Somersham, St. Ives, Brampton and Bluntisham – just to name a few).

Planning applications for 31 Church Way, Little Stukeley 1400199FUL and 23 Church Road, Great Stukeley 1400286FUL/1400287LBC were considered and approval recommended.

The Parish Council was greatly concerned about the effect of staff changes in HDC Planning Department, especially considering the current development pressures in Huntingdon (Alconbury Weald/Local Plan close to submission/A14 Consultation). The Council has written to the HDC to express the Council's concerns and to ask what HDC propose to do to overcome its staffing difficulties.

The next Parish Council Meeting is to be held on Monday 12th May at 7:30pm at Great Stukeley Village Hall.

Please note that the **Parish Council Elections are to be held on 22nd May 2014**, if you are interested in standing for election as a Parish Councillor or would just like some more information about the role please contact me for an informal chat.

| 12 oz rice | Seasoning |
| 14 oz can tomatoes | 10 oz cooked shrimps or prawns |
| 1 chopped onion | 1 green pepper chopped |
| 1 pint water | 2 tsp chilli seasoning |
